

Permitted Outdoor Burning



Permits are given to residents, who live out of the populated areas, to allow open burning for the purpose of getting rid of brush. Material that is not permitted to be burned is: construction material, trash, leaves, and grass clippings. These items are governed by the DEQ clean air act, DNR, and local fire codes.

A campfire is permitted for cooking or recreational purposes, in populated areas, if in an approved fire container. Examples of such containers are shown in the pictures below.



Fires in these types of containers, for cooking or recreational purposes, can be done without a permit in your back yard.
